# Canadian Symbols at Parliament



This animal works hard and has a big, flat tail. It is Canada's national animal.	<b>BEAVER</b>
This little red flower is used to remember soldiers, especially around Remembrance Day.	<b>POPPY</b>
This big animal has antlers and lives in many different parts of Canada.	<b>MOOSE</b>
This mythical creature has a horn on its head. It is a symbol of Scotland.	<b>UNICORN</b>
This person grows food. They symbolize a job done by many Canadians.	<b>FARMER</b>
This mythical bird is shown rising from the ashes. It is a symbol for the main Parliament Building, which was rebuilt after a fire in 1916.	<b>PHOENIX</b>
This sea mammal is important to many First Nations communities, especially on the West Coast.	<b>ORCA</b>
This fire-breathing creature represents Wales.	<b>DRAGON</b>
This flower represents France.	<b>FLEUR-DE-LYS</b>
The person in this stone carving is gathering food and fuel for their community.	<b>INUK HUNTER</b>
This stone carving represents the Monarch (the King or Queen).	<b>CROWN</b>
This tower was named to honour the end of the First World War.	<b>PEACE TOWER</b>
The bands on the sides of this Canadian symbol represent the Atlantic and Pacific oceans.	<b>CANADIAN FLAG</b>
These symbols represent Canada's 13 provinces and territories.	<b>PROVINCIAL AND TERRITORIAL SHIELDS</b>
This leaf is an important Canadian symbol.	<b>MAPLE LEAF</b>
This person represents communities who live along Canada's coasts.	<b>SAILOR</b>
This forest scene is a symbol of Canada's northern landscapes.	<b>STAINED GLASS WINDOW</b>
This gold object is carved with many details. It is a symbol of the Senate.	<b>MACE (SENATE)</b>
This gold object is carved with many details. It is a symbol of the House of Commons.	<b>MACE (HOUSE OF COMMONS)</b>
